# NOTES AND MEASURES



---

The Kingston Kiwanis Music Festival concludes its 53<sup>rd</sup> year of operation with the Highlights Concert at the Isabel Bader Centre for the Performing Arts on the evening of April 28<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 PM. Admission is by donation and everyone is invited.

## PARTICIPATION ON THE RISE

This year we had 523 registrations for the Festival and over 1,000 participants: this is a 4% increase in registrations over 2025 and a 19% increase in participants. The surge in participants reflected an encouraging 30% increase in band, ensemble, and voice registrations. Sadly, choir registrations were down – a trend we are hoping to reverse in 2027 working with our community partners.

## THANKS TO OUR SUPPORTERS

The Festival would not happen without the generous support of community organizations and local businesses, the time and dedication of the volunteers who operate the festival, and the expertise of the music teachers and accompanists in our community. We are grateful to the Ballytobin Foundation which, since 2016, has funded the Highlights Concert at the Isabel, the Anna and Edward Churchill Foundation, and the Kiwanis Club of Kingston for generous annual operating grants; we also appreciate the financial and moral support of the Ontario Registered Music Teachers' Association and the Kingston Symphony Volunteers as well as the many individuals who donate operating funds. And we thank those families and individuals whose donations for awards since the Festival's inception have built a significant awards fund which allows us to provide over \$10,000 in awards annually.

## NEW AWARDS

This year we welcome the creation of five new awards: The Cook Family Intradisciplinary Vocal Award – for a performer with gold or platinum standings in Classical, Musical Theatre, and Pop Voice; the Pedlar Debut Choir Award – for a first time school or community choir entry; the Pedlar Family Award for an Elementary School Band; an additional award from ORMTA created in memory of Bev Porter; and an award for the best piano performer under age 12 financed by an anonymous donor.

# KINGSTON KIWANIS MUSIC FESTIVAL SOUVENIR TOTE BAGS

Participants at this year's festival had the opportunity to purchase our new KKMf tote bags. The bags are made of a durable, washable blend of cotton and polyester and are specially sized to hold music and other accessories.

The tote bags will be on sale in the lobby of the Isabel before and after the Highlights Concert. The bag is a practical and good looking souvenir of the festival to show around town. The price is \$15/bag (cash or e-transfer) and revenue from sales support the Festival.



## NEW FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGNS

This year, to keep registration fees from rising, we initiated two new major fundraising campaigns to offset increasing venue, insurance, and adjudicator costs: a Sponsorship program to replace our previous advertising campaign; and a Friend of the Festival program to encourage individual donors. Attendees at this year's Festival have noticed that, at many sessions, there was a large sign announcing a sponsor for that session. Businesses or organizations paid a \$300 or \$400 fee or provided free services to the Festival to become a sponsor. The list of this year's 16 sponsors on pages 8-9 demonstrates the breadth of support from our local businesses and institutions. We thank St. Lawrence Place Retirement Living for being the pioneer in this campaign. Of special note this year are the sponsorships from the Limestone District School Board and from the Music Office, Tourism Kingston. Like ourselves, these organizations are dedicated to developing the musical infrastructure in our community and we look forward to working with them. We have also encouraged individuals to support the festival by donating \$100 to become a Friend of the Festival. Those donations provide critical support for our operations.
